1. Programme Overview:

Urbanisation, high rate of population hike, increasing agricultural activity, industrial use poses unusual pressure on ground water level on earth, global warming, changing climate scenario, erratic rainfall pattern also had impacted availability of ground water. Already many countries even some parts of India are suffering from acute shortage of surface water. If we do not become cautious about the situation soon it will become disastrous. Presently 45% of Indian population is facing severe water crisis. Already cities like Delhi, Chennai, Bengaluru facing problem of usable water supply which is predicted to be more severe by 2030. In west Bengal some villages of Bankura, Purulia and Birbhum are facing acute crisis during summer months. It is the high time to change our mindset for rationally use the available water, implementing advanced water policy, promoting micro irrigation and less water use efficient crop plants. Even in this critical situation, the silver lining is that most of the states of India, some districts of West Bengal in particular due to unique geographical location are adequately rain fed. Many a times due to excessive rain in the season many cities, towns agricultural lands are over flooded. One plausible solution to the water deficiency of other places may be tackled by harvesting the rain water without allowing it to waste and judiciously store it and utilize when needed.

That needs spreading of this idea to common people and young generations, make them aware about the techniques and intricacies of harvesting rain water in hygienic way at domestic level, community level and industrial level. The present proposal has been formulated to conduct two days seminars/ workshop in the form of lectures by eminent speakers of this area and hands on demonstration using model to college and high school level students.

2. Objectives of the Programme

- To spread awareness about water crisis of India and climate-induced groundwater depletion
- To introduce students to the principles of rain water harvesting
- To train participants using working models and hands-on demonstrations
- To encourage rational water use, micro-irrigation, and sustainable water policy understanding
- To promote green behaviour and responsible environmental practice
- To stimulate scientific interest among students and young citizens

4. Expected Outcomes

- Participants will develop an improved understanding of groundwater issues and the impacts of climate change.
- They will gain knowledge of practical rainwater harvesting systems.
- The programme will enhance scientific curiosity and promote environmental responsibility among students.

- Students will be able to design simple rainwater harvesting models and will apply the concepts learned during the sessions.
- Awareness will be strengthened through interactive, quiz-based learning activities.
- The programme will motivate youth to promote rainwater harvesting in their homes, schools, and communities.


The presentations were followed by discussions and Quiz , organised by Nitesh and Biprajit, with young participants , who participated with much enthusiasm.



OF

"KOLKATA NIVEDITA SHAKTI"

CHAPTER-1

MEMBERSHIP:

a) Signatories to this memorandum of the Association shall be the first members of Nivedita shakti.

b) Any woman who is interested in the aims & objects of the society, over 18 years of age, irrespective of caste, creed or religion and who agrees in writing to be bound by the Memorandum of Association and ^{Bhattacharya 5/4/12} Rules & Regulations of the society, may be admitted as a member of the society, subject to the approval of the Executive Council. A minor may also be admitted with the prior permission of his/her legal guardian subject to the consent by the Executive Council. Each category of member has his respective subscriptions and duration depending upon the class he belongs. Needless to mention that whole hearted participation in the execution of objectives of the society is given the foremost importance.

CLASS OF MEMBERS: The Society shall have the following classes of members:

a. **Honorary Member:** Any person whose involvement in the society is deemed to be useful, may with the consent of such person be nominated as Honorary member of the society. Such member shall not, however, be eligible to be member of the Governing Body nor shall be entitled to vote in any meeting.

b. **Life Member:** Any person who wants to associate with the society life long, qualified to be a member, by paying such amount at a time which shall be determined by the Executive Council from time to time, may be admitted as a Life Member of the society by the Executive Council.



She is convicted of any offence in connection with the formation, promotion, management or conduct of affairs of a society or a body corporate or of any offence involving moral turpitude.

3. TERM OF ELECTION:

All members of the Executive Council shall retire at the annual general body meeting every interval of two years following their election when the new Executive Council shall be formed. An existing body would serve for a maximum of three terms in succession. No member can hold the same post in the EC for more than three terms in succession.

4. MEETING:



PROCEDURE OF THE MEETING :

The President or in her absence, any one of the Vice-Presidents shall preside over all meetings of the Executive Council. In their absence the member present shall elect a Chairman of the meeting. All questions before the meeting will be decided by a majority of vote each member having one vote. The President or the Chairman shall have a 2nd or casting vote in addition to her own vote in case of equality of votes.

6. EXECUTIVE COUNCIL: Composition, Election/Appointment,

BANK OPERATION: The banking accounts of the society shall be operated by the President, Secretary and Treasurer, any two of them jointly.

C) SAFE CUSTODY OF FUNDS: The Executive Committee of the society shall be responsible for the safe custody of the funds and assets of the society. The funds of the society shall be kept in bank or post office and be invested in any securities as specified u/s. 20 of the Indian Trust Act, 1882.

D) ACCOUNTING YEAR: The Accounting year of the society shall be from 1st day of April to 31st March of the following year.

E) BOOKS OF ACCOUNTS, INSPECTION OF AND AUDIT:

The books of accounts and other statutory books shall be kept at the Registered Office of the society and shall be kept open for inspection of the members of the Executive Committee during usual office hours and the same shall be kept open for inspection of the member of the society at such time and place as the Governing Body directs on a written request made by any member. The society shall maintain accounts which will be audited annually by a qualified auditor or auditors.

The annual return shall be filed with the registrar of societies, West Bengal within a month from the date of annual general meeting.

The report of the auditor shall be filed with register of societies West Bengal along with other returns as required under the provisions of section 17 of the act.

11. GENERAL MEETINGS:

There shall be three kinds of general meetings: (a) Annual General Body Meeting, and (b) Special Meeting and (c) Emergency Meeting.

A) ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING: The society shall hold an annual general body meeting every year and not more than 15 months shall elapse between two successive annual general meetings. At least 14 days notice specifying the time, place, day and hour shall be given for Annual General Meeting. The business to be transacted at the annual general meeting shall be-


