An object in the sky with luminance is called Luminary. The branch of science deals with luminary in the sky is called Astronomy. Amateur Astronomy is a hobby for wonder and enjoyment where people observe, photograph celestials objects like stars, planets, nebulae etc by naked eye to binoculars / telescope from casual star gazing to genuine scientific calculations.

**Aims and Objectives:**

- i) To educate participants about astronomy and to inculcate scientific approach of astronomy vis-a-vis space science
- ii) Provide hands-on experience with observational tools, Binocular and Telescopes.
- iii) Learning Observational astronomy Techniques.
- iv) Discussion and Hands-on experiments to find longitude and latitude of a place, Diameter of Sun, Making refracting telescope etc.
- v) Foster an appreciation for the night sky as a hobby or potential career path.

### **Detailed programme :**

Activities will cater to various interests and skill levels, from naked-eye stargazing to basic astrophotography and scientific data collection as follows.

- a).Discussion on different aspects, observation system-Geocentric and Heliocentric, Celestial poles, equator, ecliptic, equinox-autumnal and vernal, nadir and zenith, pole star, circum polar star, binary star system, star magnitude system
- b).Primary method of Sky gazing, Finding North Pole, Angular height of a star, Diameter of sun and preparation of Refracting telescope, How to read star chart etc
- c) **Night Sky Viewing** - involves observing the night sky through various equipment like binoculars and telescopes, focusing on different celestial objects such as the Moon, planets (Jupiter, Saturn, Mars), constellations, star clusters, nebulae, and galaxies (e.g., the Andromeda Galaxy).
- d) **Solar Observation:** Safely observe the Sun during the daytime using a solar-filtered telescope or a solar projection device to view sunspots and solar activity.
- e) **Telescope Basics** Offer training on how telescopes work, different types of mounts, how to set up and maintain equipment, and how to use various eyepieces and accessories.
- f) **Tracking Celestial Events:** Planning dates for activities around lunar and solar eclipses, meteoroids shower and other special astronomical phenomena.
- g). **Build a Model Solar System:** Create a scale model of the solar system using simple materials like paper or play dough to understand the relative distances between planets.
- h) **Moon Phase Demonstration:** Use a dark room, a bright lamp (representing the Sun), and a Styrofoam ball on a pencil to visually demonstrate the phases of the moon and why they occur
- i) **Astrophotography Basics:** Introduce the basics of capturing images of the night sky, from using a standard camera on a tripod to more advanced techniques with tracking mounts.
- j) **Astronomy Quizzes & Games:** Interactive quizzes or creating a "constellation transformation" activity where participants imagine and create new constellation patterns.





3. COLOUR

4. CREST

The official year shall begin with from 1st April of the  
year to 31st March following.

6. OBJECTS:

initiative or at the request of Government, Semi-Government

booklet, computer taining, excussion in the related field.

- g) To adopt such other measures for the promotion of activities in the field of science for National Interest.
- h) To sponsor scholarships, stipends, books etc. for the sake of its activities.
- i) To do all such things as may be deemed incidental or conductive to the attainment of the forgoing objects.

7. INCOME & PROPERTY



**RULES & REGULATIONS  
OF  
SCIENCE CENTRE**

**1. Membership:**

a) Any person agreeing with the aims and objectives of the society and to abide by the rules of the society is eligible for being admitted as a member of the Society.

b) Any society or Research & study Institute having objects similar to the objects of the society may be affiliated to the society on fulfilling the conditions fixed from time to time by the Governing Body.

**2. Class of Members:**

The membership of the society will be of the following categories -

a) Individual member, (b) Honorary member, (c) Founder member  
d) Life member, (e) Student member, (f) Institutional member,  
g) Patron.


a) Any individual qualified to be a member and paying membership fee Rs.20/- which may enhanced by the G.B. from time to time & other fees as decided by the Governing Body from time to time, may be admitted as an individual member of the society.

b) Honorary members will be selected by the Governing Body from distinguished persons and who have rendered outstanding service to the causes of the Association. Such members will be eligible to attend meetings but shall not be eligible to hold any office.

c) The founder members shall be eligible to attend all meetings, to vote & shall be eligible to be elected to the Governing Body.

d) Life members shall be elected by the Governing Body after being proposed and seconded by members of G.B. of the Society. They shall get all the privileges & rights of membership. A life member has to pay a subscription of Rs. 250/- or as decided by G.B. from time to time at a time or in two instalments within a year.

e) Student and Research scholars shall be eligible to become a member by applying and paying a subscription as decided by the Governing Body from time to time.

f) Any institution or organisation engaged in similar work and having similar objects of the society and paying a membership fees Rs. 40.00 annum may be an affiliated unit. The Secretary of the affiliated institution or his representative will get all the privileges of a member.

g) Any outstanding person whose advice will accelerate the activities of the society, and proposed and accepted by the Governing Body will be a patron of the society. He may attend meetings only.

3. Cessation of Membership :

Any member shall cease to be a member

a) on his conviction of any offence in condition with the formation, promotion or management of the conduct of the affairs of the society.

b) on his resignation from membership by a letter addressed to the president or Secretary.

c) on his/her death.

d) on becoming insance.

e) on becoming a defaulter in paying membership fee.

4. Expulsion or suspension -

The Governing Body shall have the right to suspend or expel any member of any type as a consequence of -

a) infringement of the constitution, rules, regulations  
b) misconduct to the society.

5. Register of members

The society shall maintain a register of members stating Bio-dates of members. The Register shall be kept open for inspection of the members of the Society on requisition.

6. Privileges of membership -

All members of the society will have the right to  
a) attend meeting, b) to take part in general activities,  
c) to attend conference, d) to use library of the society when organised, e) to receive mainfests etc. & e) as decided by the Governing Body.

7. Payment of fees :

The membership fees as decided by the Governing Body shall be paid from 1st April to 30th April for that year only. either in one instalment & in two. In case of payment by instalment one instalment must be paid by the 30th April of that year.

7A. OFFICIAL YEAR :

8. Governing Body :-

i) Composition & Election :-

There shall be a Governing Body consisting of not less than 7 and not more than 11 members and will be composed of founder members and elected members. Elected members shall be elected at the Annual general meeting of the Society. The office bearers of the Governing Body shall consist of President, Vice-President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer. The office bearers shall be elected by the Governing Body from amongst themselves.

ii) Meeting : A meeting of Governing Body shall be held at least once in three months at such place and time as the President or the Secretary may determine.

iii) Proceedings of meeting : Proceedings of all meetings should be written following all discussions.

9. Requisitioned meeting:

Two third members of the Governing Body or total members may submit a signed notice for requisitioned meeting with specific agenda. The Hony. General Secretary shall then within fifteen days of receipt of such notice convene a meeting of G. Body or General meeting respectively informing members as required. If the Secretary failed to do so the signatories will approach the President and the President will convene or empowered any signatory to convene such meeting.

10. Annual General Meeting:

Annual general meeting will be held in every year within 31st May of that year & with 14 days notice shall be given to members. The agenda of General meeting will be as follows:

- a) to confirm the proceedings of the last General meeting/ special General meeting if any.
- b) to adopt report of work of the Society for the previous year.
- c) to pass audited statement of a/cs. for the said year.
- d) to appoint qualified auditor for the next financial year.
- e) to transact other business as may be fixed by the G.B.

f) to transact such other business as may be brought forward by giving 14 days notice from any member.

g) to conduct general election for G.B. & office bearers.

11. Emergency meeting:- Emergency meeting may be convened by 24 hours notice & by the president himself.

12. Special General Meeting :- When Annual General meeting can not be convened but meeting of general members is necessary, special general meeting may be convened by clear 14 days notice to members with specific agenda.

13. Quorum : The quorum of different meeting will be as follows:

- a) G.B. meeting - 1/3 of G.B. members.
- b) Annual General meeting or Special General Meeting 1/4th of total members.
- c) No quorum shall be needed for an adjourned meeting.

14. Procedure of Meeting : The President, or in his absence the Vice-President shall preside over all meetings of the G.B. and in their absence members present shall elect a Chairman of the meeting. All questions before the meeting will be decided by a majority of votes, each member having one vote. The President or the Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his own vote in case of tie in vote.

14. Powers & Duties of Governing Body :

The Governing Body shall have general power of suspension and conduct over all affairs of the society & in particular shall discharge the following duties:-

- a) To appoint sub-committee with power and duties as delegated by G.B.
- b) To accept donation, gift, subscription, movable or immovable property for the objects of the society.
- c) To sell, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of any deal with all or any part of the property of the Society as deemed necessary or expedient for the purpose of the society.
- d) To keep proper a/cs. of the society & to find bankers for the society.
- e) To accept or reject application of membership.

- f) to ask any member to resign if deemed by the G.B. his/her conduct prejudicial to the interest of the society or is calculated to bring the society in disrepute. In case of his/her refusal to do so his/her name will be removed from the register of members provided at least 15 days notice of meeting of G.B. intending to remove his/her name shall have been given to the member concerned.
- g) to approve budget for the society.
- h) to dismiss & take measures on matters related to the fulfilment of objective.

15. Safe Custody of funds:

- a) The G.B. or the trustee of the society shall be responsible for the safe custody of the funds and assets of the society.
- b) The funds of the society shall be kept in some nationalised Bank and be invested in any securities specified under section 20 of the Indian trust Act. 1882.

16. Duties of Office Bearers :

President - a) He shall preside over all meetings of the society.  
b) He shall advise the society on all points of disputes and general look after the interest of the society.  
c) He shall call emergency meetings with due notice.

Vice-President : Vice-President shall assist the president and preside over meetings in absence of the President and perform duties as empowered by the President.

SECRETARY : He shall i) convene all meetings and maintain books of meetings.

- ii) Issue general circular and notices and carry on all correspondence on behalf of the society.
- iii) sign on behalf of the society along with one or more signatories as directed by the G.B.
- iv) give pay order as directed by the G.B.
- v) transact ~~in~~ all other business subject to the direction of the G.B.

Treasurer : He will

- i) look after the financial administration according to the directions of the G.B. and evolve guidelines for overall fiscal and financial policy of the society.
- ii) shall operate a/cs along with one or more signatories as directed by G.B.
- iii) maintain a/cs. and cash book in consultation with the secretary.

**17. SUIT AND LEGAL PROCEEDINGS:**

All suits and legal proceedings by or against the Society shall be in the name of the Secretary or by such person as shall be appointed by the G.B.

**18. ALTERATION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

The rules and regulations may be altered, modified, rescinded or added to by special resolutions passed by the members in general meeting called for the purpose by = 1/4th majority of the members present at such meeting.

**19. DISSOLUTION OF THE SOCIETY :**

The Society may be dissolved by a resolution to that effects passed by the majority 1/4th of the members present at a general meeting. The said meeting shall also decide the proportionate disbursement of the funds and assets of the Society, if any after dissolution.

## **Preface:**

Some eminent professors, teachers and students initiated to establish a Centre for cultivating scientific thoughts and popularizing science in different domain people especially among students to uplift their scientific temper, attitude and spark the inquisitiveness in science and scientific activities for the benefit of oneself and society and initiation came into existence in the name of Science Centre in 1987 . It's registered society having registered and working office address at Vidyasagar Sarani, Golkuchawlk, PO- Midnapore, Dist- Paschim Medinipur, West Bengal, Pin-721 101



### **Resource Kits**

The Centre possessed resource kits on Soil - Water and Food Adulteration, received during YSA-04, Water Testing Kit of Central Pollution Control Board and poster set of exhibits on "Land marks in Physics", "Evolution of science" science exhibits / models and teaching aids materials. The Centre used those resources throughout the year by lending free of cost at the request of other institutions.

### **Vision:**

The Centre had gathered experiences from its day to day activities in last thirty six years that schools are the weakest Centre for scientific activities as most of the schools had not appended with a lab for upper primary section. The folding lab idea had been generated by Dr. S.C.Samanta, member-expert for activity based science learning and motivate students in pursuing study and research in future could help schools in this direction, if adopted.
